Author's Note

I planted the seeds of *Overlooked Latinas* while working on my prior award-winning, solo show *The Rita Hayworth of this Generation* (2010-2015), directed by Mary Guzmán, with development assistance and dramaturgy by David Ford. It was then that I conceived the idea of creating the secret sequel *Overlooked Latinas* in which two of my *Rita* characters would also appear. While researching Latinx trailblazer movie stars from the 1920's-1950's, I felt compelled to share their stories of struggle and trauma as they confronted racism, sexism, homophobia, and xenophobia during the McCarthy Era and the Red Scare.

Post 2016 election, I wanted to show how fascist leaders in government had used white supremacy, hateful policies, and anti-immigrant propaganda to harass Latinx communities in the past.

Overlooked Latinas is an homage to the Latinx/LGBTQIA+ movie stars who came before us and paved the way for millions of us Latinx/BIPOC/LGBTQIA+ artists. As a mixed-race Mexican queer/lesbian artist, Overlooked Latinas reminds me to forge ahead with the attitude of "tomorrow is a better day," and together in solidarity forever we can break all the glass ceilings from the stage to the screen.

I am humbly grateful and inspired to have worked on four solo shows with Mary Guzmán over the past fifteen years. I am deeply thankful that the beloved trailblazing queer theater Theatre Rhinoceros invited Mary and me to present *Overlooked Latinas* as a live, on-line production land for all of you.

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
