Acceptance of the past doesn't always mean reconciliation, but it does mean we are free to move forward and grow. I'd like to think that's where this paly leaves Evander and family. A special thanks from me to the Julian for creating this richly moving text for Theatre Rhinoceros, Richard for so majestically realizing it, and Rachel, Armando and Jake for bringing it so vividly to life every night.

Author's Note

I wrote the original one-act version, *Alligator Mouth*, for Horse & Cart Theatre in Denver in 2014. Since then, my theatrical voice has changed quite a bit. What started as a realism play has now become a twistedly queer memory play. Steeped in Magical Realism this play tackles what happens to us when memories betray. When our emotions are heightened and we are desperate for affection we begin to question reality, especially when confronted with trauma. Playwriting awards include: New Dramatist Residency (Class of 2025), 2019/2020 Rita Goldberg Playwrights' Workshop Fellow at The Lark, 2017 & 2018 Pipeline Theatre Company PlayLab, 2018 LaGuardia Community College's LGBTQ History Project Grant, 2015 Queens Arts Council Grant, 2009 Public Theater Emerging Writers Group, and 2014 Best New Work Motif Award. Productions include: Man Boobs (Pride Films & Plays, 2011), Nico was a Fashion Model (Counter-Productions, 2013), Animals Commit Suicide (First Floor Theater, 2015), Locusts Have No King (INTAR, 2016), and Bundle of Sticks (INTAR, 2020). He wrote the book for LatinXoxo at Joe's Pub in 2019. He is a co-producer and co-writer of the hit web series, Bulk, and an Associate Professor of Theatre at Queensborough Community College.

RACHEL GRACE REYES MORAN (Stage Manager) is a Bay Area native Stage Manager as well as Resident Artist with Crowded Fire. LGBT Community by *Adelante Magazine*.

We develop and produce works of theatre that enlighten, enrich, and explore both the ordinary and the extraordinary aspects of our queer community.
