From the Playwright

I wrote *Pillow Talk* to myself at 28-years old.

Pillow Talk is not a love story. It's not a sex story. It's a play about two men seeking intimacy from their contrasting Black male perspectives. Human beings live our lives for intimacy. It's a human need; yet, too many people don't associate Black men with intimacy.

This play is about different kinds of intimacy. It even explores a boy's first intimate bond after his mother - the intimate bond between father and son. That bond appeared to be broken - but can it ever be broken?

I excerpted this play from my full-length play *Locker Room and Pillow Talk* to fit it into the virtual format. Making a virtual play about intimacy was not just ironic, but challenging. However, director Tanika and her posse creatively and technically tell the story in a way that is unique to virtual theater.

From the Director

Black men have always been Kings. I love Black men in all their glory and nuance. In 2020 we witnessed multiple slayings of innocent Black men. Those who were fathers and sons. Husbands and lovers. All they had been guilty of was living out loud. Breaking an invisible social code long established as a boundary of their possibility. As a Black queer woman I have suffered watching my brothers slain and for this Juneteenth and Pride Month, I vow to assist them in telling the stories that center their voices.

Some of our most veracious conversations we traverse will be during pillow talk. Where we stare in our lover's eyes and release our private reveries, the highlights of our day and our truest self. When we pillow talk we tell the truth or we entice the other person with what they may want to hear. We let our guard down. We keep it real. We keep it. It is a delicate dance of desire and restlessness. Life is on the tip of your heart.

Through the dynamic and devastatingly brilliant playwright Kheven LaGrone's *Pillow Talk*, we get to experience a certain style of love that is often hidden and silenced. Intimacy between two Black men who love on one another albeit through transaction. Chuck and Baby Boy's intimacy challenges them both to lean into truth and trust. Sometimes we are forced to confront ourselves as we interact with others. Through our struggles to accept parts of our identity we attract our teacher. That guide who has resolved and mastered our struggle within themself to show us a new way. It can be a

wake-up call or the universe's way of presenting an opportunity for healing. All within the confines of a car. The right car can change your life.

I hope you enjoy this ride tonight and thank you to Theatre Rhinoceros, our incredible production team and this gifted dynamic duo, Devin and RaMond, for the journey home.

I've always loved Kheven's work, its locality, its passion, its exploration of passionate lives. We had a great time with *The Legend of Pink* in 2017 and it's great to be able to spend some more time with his characters, again in Oakland and again in a World Premiere. Chuck and Baby Boy are so unique – a compassionate and needy authority figure, a young prostitute who has so much more to offer than sex – and yet they are universal, for who cannot relate to the desire for companionship or the need for mentorship. This play seems to be about connecting but it carries with it a much larger message, and in Chuck's growing awareness of how he can actually help Baby Boy we see that by so doing he might actually help himself. And that, I feel, is the true nature of empathy – it helps all parties.

Devin A. Cunningham (Baby Boy) is an actor and singer from Oakland, CA. He has worked with Theatre Rhinoceros throughout the pandemic in their virtual play reading series. He recently relocated to Savannah, GA where he currently misses the cool of the Bay Area, especially its inviting and present audiences.

Maya Herbsman (she/hers – Intimacy Consultant) is a Bay Area/Ohlone land-based intimacy director, director, and teaching artist. She is also the Associate Artistic Director of Cutting Ball Theater. Favorite intimacy direction credits include work at Berkeley Repertory Theatre, TheatreWorks Silicon Valley, Shotgun Players, Z Space, and San Francisco Playhouse. Maya is a certified intimacy director through Intimacy Directors and Coordinators.

Kheven LaGrone (Playwright) is a Bay Area native whose writing has appeared in *Transition Magazine, Media Ethics, Journal of African American Men,* and *The Journal of Human and Civil Rights.* His play *The Legend of Pink* was produced by Theatre Rhinoceros in the Fall, 2017. An advocate for the Bay Area homeless community, his essays have appeared in *Street Spirit* and *San Francisco Bayview.* Mr. LaGrone has also edited a collection of scholarly essays on Alice Walker's *The Color Purple.* He has curated a number of art exhibits in San Francisco, New York, and Atlanta, including "I Am San Francisco: (Re)Collecting the Stories of Native Black San Franciscans," "I Am America: Black Genealogy Through the Eyes of an Artist," "Coloring Outside the Lines: Black Cartoonists as Social Commentators," and "BABA: Black Artists' Expressions of Father." Mr. LaGrone earned his M.A. in Communications from Emerson College and is the author of several one-act plays and solo shows, some of which have been made into videos.

Wesley Allen Murphy (Sound and Video Designer) is excited to be working on his second show with Theatre Rhinoceros. He worked previously on designing sound and video for *The Review*. Wesley is a professional multi-instrumentalist who has played in various bands in Northern California specializing in 5-string banjo and bass guitar. In 2014 he went on a national tour with singer-songwriter Brianna Lea Pruett. He has recorded at Bob Weir's TRI Studios in San Rafael, Canyon Records in Arizona, and Daytrotter Studios in Chicago. He has been nominated for two Elly awards, including Sound Design for his original score in Folsom Lake College's *Alice in Wonderland*.

Wilfred Paloma (Choreographer) is an Actor's Equity member with an M.A. in Theatre Arts from San Diego State University and is also a graduate of the Meisner and Chekhov Integrated Acting Studio. Wilfred works with La Jolla Playhouse, Arts for Learning, Young Actors Theater, San Diego Junior Theatre, and Blindspot Collective, and owns a private Performing Arts studio in San Diego, CA.
