But it focuses on the day to day of a relationship, and that relationship, while bitchy and competitive, is full of bliss, love, and sauciness. And that is the very nature of survival. How do people survive? Through life, boisterous, glorious life. I can't think of a better story to return us to the property of the living theatre than *Wake*. Director's Note

As Vickie wisely states ``the enemy, the big pharma companies and the NRA and whatever, they want us to sit around hating each other.." Our Queens Courtney and Vickie, grant us up close and intimate access to their private selves as they work through their health, love and costume changes. Everyone loves a fierce Queen. She's usually done up impeccably, her mug or makeup flawless, her hair on fleek and her gown usually long enough to drag hence the term "Drag Queen. But what do they look like out of the spectacle of stage attire and what are they going through behind closed dressing room doors?

We celebrate Drag Queens for their display of creativity and femininity they contribute to mainstream society but we don't hold space for their human conditions. Their health, their sustainability. We have relegated the Drag Artists to the role of commodity for our entertainment as opposed to seeing them as human beings who may struggle financially and internally. This play serves to announce to the world there is a discrepancy between the medical treatment of rich and poor people, with an even greater discrepancy evident when race is involved.

Terry Guest, our playwright, has created an exemplary tribute to his uncle and true Queen Courtney Berringers in *At the Wake*. It has been a privilege and honor to tell this story with two outstanding and giving artists such as Devin and Mario. Thank you John, Joe, Isaac, Seafus, Wesley and Colin for the space, time and teamwork. Lastly, thank you dear audience for your support of our community. We need you and you definitely need the Queens!

Tanika Baptiste (Director/Costume Designer/Choreographer) is absolutely elated to direct her fourth production with Theatre Rhinoceros. Originally from San Diego, she has worked as a Director, Producer, Actor and Vocalist in both the San Francisco Bay Area and SD. Her most recent Bay Area directorial credits include *Pillow Talk, The Review or How to Eat Your Opposition (*Theatre Rhino) and *Rachel* (SBMT). SD credits: *Clybourne Park* (Character Physics), *The desTROYers* (Old Globe Theatre - Powers New Voices Festival), and *Fires in the Mirror* (Trinity Theatre Company). She has performed and/or directed with La Jolla Playhouse, San Diego REP, Berkeley Repertory Theatre's Ground Floor, Marin Shakespeare Company, The Old Globe, American Conservatory Theatre, Lorraine Hansberry Theatre and Diversionary Theatre.

Seafus Chatmon-Smith (Scenic Designer) is a recipient of San Francisco Bay Area Theatre Critics' Circle "Excellence in Theatre" award for his 2019 scenic design of Admissions for Los Altos Stage Company.
